"We anticipate about the same number of clients this year," said Gaskins, "and we will be able to spend a bit more on each child and adult because of the generous donations last year.'

In 2015, the community \$29,226.70 donated and Christmas Friends helped 207 children and 90 elderly or disabled adults, said Christmas Friends secretary and shopping director Bettie Lee Gaskins.
