

Fr. Stuart's Message for April, 2017 —

Almighty God, whose most dear Son went not up to joy, but first he suffered pain and entered not into glory before he was crucified: Mercifully grant that we, walking in the way of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace; through the same thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen. (Collect for Monday of Holy Week).

"Alleluia. Christ is risen. The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia." With these words, we begin our Easter celebration and we announce and affirm the central conviction of our faith; that God raised Jesus from the dead. The tomb was empty and not because Jesus' body had been taken from it, but because God has said "yes" to Jesus and "no" to the powers that killed him. Jesus lives and because he lives, he is as much a part of our lives as he was in the lives of his first disciples. Jesus' presence has been affirmed throughout the centuries through the experience of Christians since that first century.

In our Lenten program this year, we were reminded by the authors of "The Last Week", that Good Friday and Easter, death and resurrection together, are a central image in the Ne w Testament to the path to a transformed self. They remind us that as Christians we follow a path that involves dying to an old way of being and being reborn into a new way of being. Good Friday and Easter are about this path of dying And rising, of being born again.
