ADVENT DEVOTIONAL

One of Jean Holt's granddaughters has created a wonderful daily devotional for the four weeks of Advent till Christmas. Each card has her original watercolor artwork on it and a portion of the gospel reading appointed for that day. The first card of each week gives you the whole gospel citation if you wish to read it in your own Bible. The cards are designed to sit in an easel on your table, counter, or desk. You may want to put only one week at a time on the easel to keep it from tipping over.

A pack of these cards has been created for each household in our on-line directory and for those who have pledged but have chosen not to be in the directory. These cards have been labeled with your name and will be available in the parish hall this coming Sunday. November 21<sup>st</sup>, so that you will have them before the first day of Advent which is November 28<sup>th</sup>. They will also be available to pick up at the office on the 22<sup>nd</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup>, and 24<sup>th</sup> or at the 10:00 a.m. Thanksgiving Day service. If you know someone on the list that can't pick them up and you would be able to drop them off, that would be greatly appreciated. There are some extra packets if you would like a packet and are not on the on-line mailing list.

#### UPPER TIDEWATER REGIONAL CALENDAR

The region of the Diocese that our church is in (The Upper Tidewater Region) has created a 14 month calendar depicting pictures of all the churches in our region and the two Diocesan Schools in our region. Each month contains a short devotional and also a brief history of each church or school. These are being sold as a fundraiser for \$20.00 a calendar, but 100% of the money collected stays with the local church to be used for outreach or other needs as determined by each Vestry. If you would like to purchase one of these calendars they will be available at church on Sundays or in the office. If purchasing by check please make checks out to Christ Church Parish and note in the memo line that it is for a calendar. Christ Church is the month of October.

#### WEDNESDAY NIGHT ADVENT DINNERS AND STUDY

Beginning December 1<sup>st,</sup> we will begin our Advent dinners and study program which will be on the four Wednesdays in Advent. Dinner will be at 5:30 p.m. and we will have a sign-up sheet in the parish hall if you plan to attend the meal.

The study program will begin at 6:00 p.m. and last an hour. We will be using a curriculum entitled "Journeying the Way of Love: Advent Curriculum".

This course offers four sessions to be explored as we await the coming of Christ by moving through the first two chapters of the Gospel of Luke. Luke's gospel provides a pattern for understanding how we can live the Way of Love as individuals, as families and friends, as a community, and out in the world.

#### CONFIRMATION CLASSES TO BEGIN IN JANUARY

It has been some time since we have had a visit from a bishop in the diocese. The schedule of parish visitations for the first half of 2022 has come out and we are scheduled to have the Rt. Rev. Jennifer Brooke-Davidson at Christ Church Parish on February 27<sup>th</sup> which is the Sunday just before Ash Wednesday. Several persons have already expressed an interest in being Confirmed, Received, or Re-Affirmed at this service. Classes will begin in January and we will be using the book "Walk in Love - Episcopal Beliefs & Practices". Please let me know if you are interested so that I will know how many to prepare for.

#### **DIOCESAN CONVENTION**

Several weeks ago, the 227<sup>th</sup> annual convention of the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia took place on line. Our representatives were our clergy and Jeannette Adkins as our lay delegate. Nicole Davis, from our congregation, represented the Upper Tidewater Region as a youth delegate.

At this convention the 2022 Diocesan budget was adopted in the amount of \$5,247,300.00. This budget reflects our common work of ministry across the diocese and beyond helping to support mission congregations, campus ministries, camps and conferences, prison ministry, as well as the staff at the diocesan offices.

We also review, discuss, argue, and change resolutions that are brought before the convention by committees, churches, regions, or individuals. One of those resolutions seeks to clarify how each congregation within the diocese helps to financially support our common life together. Its intent, having passed, is to have congregations tithing to the diocesan budget by 2025 and to work toward that goal over the next few years.

Another resolution, which was presented by six clergy and four lay persons, dealt with the issue of reparations for indigenous people, Blacks, and people of color. Resolution-10a directs the Bishop to create a Reparations Task Force "to identify and propose means by which repair may begin for those areas of our structures, patterns, and common life by which Black, Indigenous, People of Color .... still carry the burden of injustices, exclusions, and biases born out of white supremacy and the legacy of slavery."

The objective of these reparation grants and loans is to provide direct benefits to BIPOC communities, people, and institutions, with preference for any which may have

been specifically harmed by past unjust actions by the Diocese of Virginia, its institutions, or churches. It calls for the setting aside of \$10,000,000 for this work over the next five years and would not be funded out of the Diocesan Budget or the congregations' donations to that budget. Instead, it would be funded through the sale of unused property assets belonging to the Diocese.

Thanks to all who have helped with the many planned and unplanned projects for 2021, with "hands on" and donations. Also, to the previous Junior Warden's for

their guidance. The Buildings and Grounds Committee meet in November to complete the Maintenance Plan for 2022-2031 and have shared it with the Finance Committee and Vestry. It will be posted in the Parish Hall. Please note that these projects are not in the budget, and will have to be funded through grants or a Capital Campaign.

In our 2022 budget are funds to do things like caring for our grounds, cleaning our buildings, and normal HVAC repair, pest control, and minor electrical and plumbing repairs. Since the last newsletter, the church ridge cap has been caulked and a ridge cap installed, the red oak in the parking lot will be removed on November 30th., ice clips are in the supply chain and will be installed soon, painting the exterior church windows has been delayed for a knee replacement to be rehabilitated and warm days.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The book drive was a success! We delivered approximately 325 books to Middlesex DSS. They were very appreciative and will be sharing those books with their clients in the days to come. Thank you for your help with this important project. This will be repeated in the future.

Our ministry project to serve our lonely neighbors is moving along. We are getting ready to schedule the training from DSS. That will take place on a Sunday in between services and will last about twenty minutes. We will also participate in online training through the diocese. The plan is for us to start visiting people in January. Please let me know if you would like to be a part of this ministry. We would love to have you be a part of our team.

In early November, Diocesan Convention was held via Zoom. Many resolutions were discussed and voted on. One that was of particular importance to me was "Deacon Compensation". I was totally against this and voted "No". Unfortunately, it passed. The purpose of this resolution was to require churches to pay deacons \$25 per month and the church would also be assessed an additional \$5 a month. This would provide deacons with access to benefits with Church Pension Group.

This was disturbing to me because I feel I was called by God to the diaconate which is a servant ministry, and I should not be paid a stipend. I also signed a Letter of Agreement with the church that did not include a stipend and I wish to honor that agreement. I am reimbursed for required expenses.

When they first started promoting this resolution, I asked that they include an opt-out clause. After several requests, it was added that this could be declined by the deacon. I am thankful for this and will be taking advantage of the opt-out clause and will not receive the monthly stipend. The blessing of being a deacon in this wonderful parish is "payment" enough for me 2

Enlisted the Garden Club of Virginia to help us restore damaged portions of the church's historic brick wall.


Participated in the church booth activities at the Urbanna Oyster Festival.


