ments.

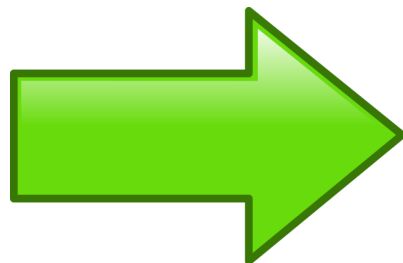
To vote at the congregational meeting, an individual must:

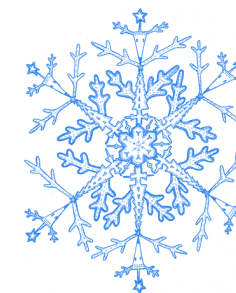

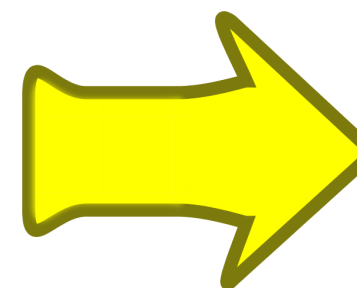


DON STEBBINS

Weekday Holy Eucharist
