

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit, we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. (I Corinthians 12:12-14)

One of their newest efforts includes developing a way for people, beyond the parish, to make contributions on-line. They will tell you that this should not be seen as a convenient way for parishioners to give because there is a cost which will slightly diminish a person's gift, but it may encourage our viewers from afar to help support us.

### **RECTOR'S SABBATICAL**

A number of parishioners have been asking me lately when am I going on sabbatical? This was first mentioned in a newsletter some months ago and I know that it's hard to keep track of time and events. I will begin my sabbatical on September 1<sup>st</sup> and return on December 1<sup>st</sup> in time to attend the ordination and consecration of the 14<sup>th</sup> Diocesan Bishop of Virginia. While I am on sabbatical, the Rev. Dr. Bob Prichard has been given permission by the Suffragan Bishop to fill in for me while I am away. My current plans still include spending two months in Scotland, England, and Ireland with my first great adventure walking the 62 mile pilgrimage route known as St. Cuthbert's Way. My plans for November are still in the planning stage. I feel confident that you all will be in excellent hands with both Bob and Deacon Peg here to keep services going and pastoral care taken care of.

### NEW ALTAR HANGINGS

On Sunday June 19<sup>th</sup> the altar and pulpit got some "new cloths." That Sunday marked the beginning of the long season in which the hangings changed to green. For the last few years, the altar has been either covered with just the fair linen or was adorned with the red coronation tapestry Jacobean frontal that went all the way to the floor. Why? Because our green hangings had become so faded that they didn't even match each other. The solution was to replace them. The problem was that no one was still making the olive green like the old hangings. The new greens clashed with the kneelers and chairs. It had been pointed out that the chasuble and stole that was presented to Fr. Stuart for his installation as rector, which is adorned with the green Verona Tapestry, does coordinate well with the altar chairs and kneelers. So, the Memorial Committee and Altar Guild approved the purchase of a new altar frontal, burse and veil (which covers the chalice on the altar), pulpit, and lectern hangings in the Verona Tapestry as well. The Vestry then gave their stamp of approval. The set was made by J. Wippell & Company Ltd. in England and look beautiful in our colonial church setting.

## Catechísm Corner

Mission: A small corner of faith, understanding and education



Other Sacramental Rites continued .. Topics are mostly edited (generally for space) taken from the Book of Common Prayer (BCP), & are meant to be a departure for further exploration, study & learning.

Q. What is Holy Matrimony? Holy Matrimony is Christian marriage, in which the couple enters into a life-long union, makes their vows before God and the Church, and receives the grace and blessing of God to help them fulfill their vows.

Q. What is Reconciliation of a Penitent? Reconciliation of a Penitent, or Penance, is the rite in which those who repent of their sins may confess them to God in the presence of a priest, and receive the assurance of pardon and the grace of absolution.

Q. What is Unction of the Sick? Unction is the rite of anointing the sick with oil, or the laying on of hands, by which God's grace is given for the healing of spirit, mind, and body.

Q. Is God's activity limited to these rites? God does not self-limit these rites; they are patterns of countless ways by which God uses material things to reach out to us.

Q. How are the sacraments related to our Christian hope? Sacraments sustain our present hope and anticipate its future fulfillment.

### **ONLINE OFFERING PLATE OPTION**

Plans are well underway to introduce an online option for donations to Christ Church Parish. Suggestions to make that feature available through our website were heard with greater frequency after recognizing that our streamed and recorded Sunday services benefit many remote viewers who are not members of our congregation. Of course, the online donation option is not a new idea insofar as many churches include a donate button on their websites. Adding this option to our website was not initially a Videography Ministry initiative, but its members had the skills to make it happen after the Finance Committee and Vestry endorsed the concept and specific details of how this could work.

To be clear, parishioners will continue to be encouraged to use personal checks and other traditional payment options to pay pledges, other large donations, and miscellaneous other offerings like flowers for the altar at Christmas and Easter. Personal checks and cash deposited into collection plates during the offertory on Sundays will also continue to be a very welcome sight! The objective here is to make it easy for anyone to support Christ Church Parish through donations in ways that suit them best. Anyone using Pay-Pal/credit online will be given the option to pay with a credit card or debit card processing fee to allow our treasury to receive the full amount of these donations.

When will evidence of the online donation feature appear on our website and Facebook and Sunday service live-stream slides? No firm launch date has been established yet, but much progress has been made in the many steps involved in implementation. You can expect an update when this online donation feature becomes available. The success of this initiative will be evaluated annually. Appropriate course corrections will be made as deemed necessary.
