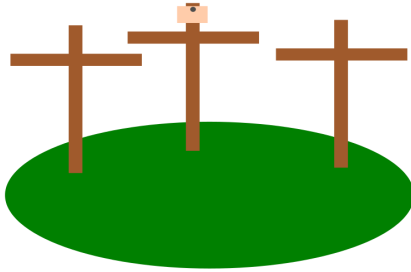

Five days ago I officiated at three different Ash Wednesday services; one at Christchurch School and two at Christ Church. For 27 years I have made the sign of the cross with

palm ashes upon the foreheads of many individuals. This was the first year that I got to look into the faces of so many young people as I said the words "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

For many clergy who only stay in a parish for five to six years at a time, they may not experience the deaths of many parishioners. But having been in one place for twenty five years, before coming here, those words on Ash Wednesday came to pass too often as I presided over the funerals of many beloved parishioners and friends; some of them very young and others living well into their 80's and 90's and two even living past 100.

These words sustain me and make it possible for me to carry on because they remind me of two important things. First they remind me that this is not our true home and that we are pilgrims passing through this life to our true place in the Kingdom of God. Second they remind me that we are heading toward the Good Friday Cross, tomb, and Easter joy and resurrection that allows us to say even at the grave, "Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia" for Christ has won the victory and opened the gates of paradise to all who call on his name.

May these days of Lent be meaningful and rewarding to you as we prepare to celebrate our Lord's resurrection.

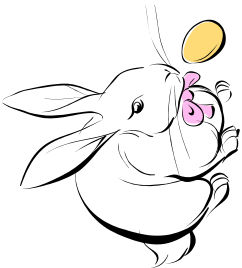

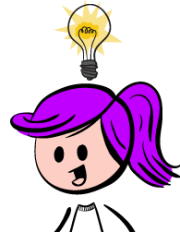

Please **RSVP** to Marilyn by March 15.

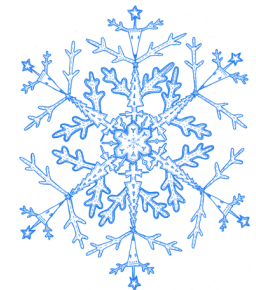
