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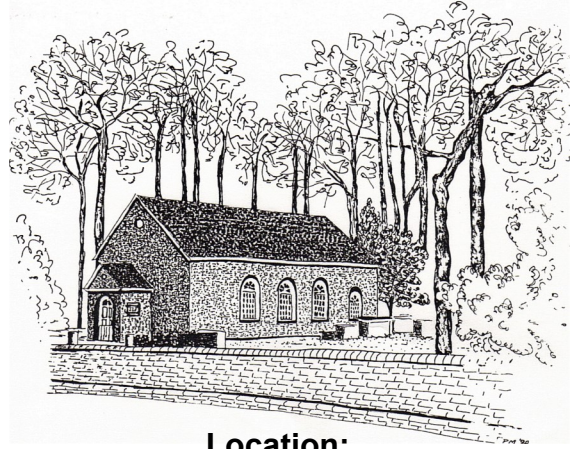

#### **From Our Rector**



#### **EASTER ISN'T JUST A DAY**

As I write this, we have just celebrated “Low Sunday” or as it is liturgically known, the Second Sunday of Easter. Why “Low Sunday?” Well, on Easter we had 28 persons worshipping at the 6:00 a.m. service and 101 individuals worshipping at the 10:00 a.m. service. Compare that with this past Sunday and the numbers dropped to 23 at 8:00 a.m. and 39 at 10:30 a.m. Actually, the numbers for this past Sunday were close to normal for us right now, but the huge drop from the week before makes it feel “Low.”

Easter Day was filled with a great deal of energy and excitement. The choir was overflowing its pews and the responses were great. But why is Easter Sunday so much different from the other Sundays of the Church Year. Does Christ’s resurrection only get celebrated one Sunday a year? No! Every Sunday of the year is a celebration of Easter, of Christ’s resurrection, and the reconciling love of God shown in this act of redemption.

Each week, the Holy Eucharist is celebrated, as the Catechism instructs us, for the continual remembrance of Christ’s life, death, and resurrection, until his coming again. It is the Church’s sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, by which the sacrifice of Christ is made present, and in which he unites us to his one offering of himself.

St. Paul, in 1 Corinthians chapter 15, reminds us that it is the Lord’s resurrection that is at the center of our Christian hope. <sup>12</sup> Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? <sup>13</sup> If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; <sup>14</sup> and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. <sup>15</sup> We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. <sup>16</sup> For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. <sup>17</sup> If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. <sup>18</sup> Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. <sup>19</sup> If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all

people most to be pitied. <sup>20</sup> **But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.**" (emphasis added)

In other words, if Easter didn't actually happen, then Jesus' teachings would have resulted in nothing and his promises would not have been fulfilled. But the Lord is alive, he walks by our side, and he reminds us, through the Easter liturgy, that pain and death are not the last word for us. Isn't that news worth our time in worship each week to praise God and to lift each other up?

"We are Easter people and 'Alleluia' is our song," preached St. Augustine of Hippo in the uncertain times in which he lived. He added, "Let us sing here and now in this life, even though we are oppressed by various worries, so that we may sing it one day in the world to come, when we are set free from all anxiety."

We continue to be oppressed by various worries in the uncertain times that we live in, but we are an Easter people, and hopefully not just one day out of the year, but every day of the year. Each day we need to rise and remind ourselves that "Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!" and carry that hope, love, and light out into the world where we may share it with others.

### **The Ministry of Deacons**

"Deacons are members of one of three distinct orders of ordained ministry (with bishops and presbyters/priests). In the Episcopal Church, a deacon exercises "a special ministry of servanthood" directly under the deacon's bishop, serving all people and especially those in need (BCP, p. 543). This definition reflects the practice of the early church, in which deacons were ordained "not to the priesthood but to the servanthood [diakonia, "ministry"] of the bishop" (Hippolytus, Apostolic Tradition). In the ancient Greek-speaking world the term diakonos meant an intermediary who acted or spoke for a superior. Christian deacons were agents of the bishop, often with oversight of charity. Since ancient times the liturgical functions of deacons have suggested the activity of angels. As they proclaim the gospel, lead intercessions, wait at the eucharistic table, and direct the order of the assembly, deacons act as sacred messengers, agents, and attendants."

Topics are mostly edited quotes (for space) taken from the Book of Common Prayer (**The Holy Eucharist**)

**What is the Holy Eucharist?** The Holy Eucharist is the sacrament commanded by Christ for the continual remembrance of his life, death, and resurrection, until his coming again.

**By what other names is this service known?** The Holy Eucharist is called the Lord's Supper, & Holy Communion, also the Divine Liturgy, the Mass, and the Great Offering.

**What is the outward and visible sign in the Eucharist?** The **outward** Eucharist sign is bread & wine, given and received according to Christ's command. The **inward** and spiritual grace in the Holy Communion is the Body and Blood of Christ given to his people and received by faith.

**What are the benefits which we receive in the Lord's Supper?** We receive the forgiveness of our sins, the strengthening of our union with Christ and one another, and the foretaste of the heavenly banquet which is our nourishment in eternal life.

**What is required of us when we come to the Eucharist?** We should examine our lives, repent of our sins, and be in love and charity with all.

### **ELEPHANT COMMITTEE**

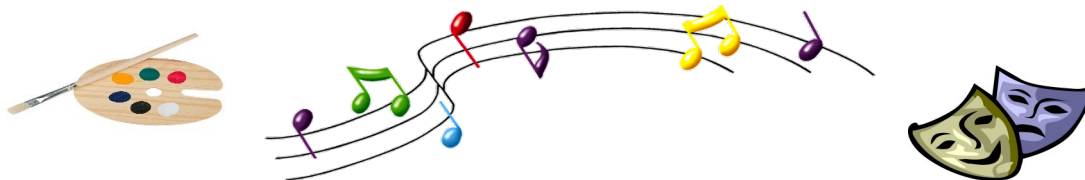
