

The Reverend Stuart Clary Wood Appointed Interim Rector for Christ Church Parish

The Vestry of Christ Church Parish, Middlesex, with the Bishop Shannon Johnston's blessings, is pleased to announce the appointment of The Reverend Stuart Clary Wood as Interim Rector. Reverend Wood's first scheduled service will be Sunday, October 11, 2015 for the "Blessing of the Animals". The Reverend Wood comes to Christ Church after serving two and a half decades at Lynnwood Episcopal Parish in Port Republic, Virginia. At Lynnwood, The Reverend Wood was the celebrant at two physical locations, officiating at three services each Sunday.

Several of our church leaders recently attended a Lynnwood Episcopal Parish service and reported "The Reverend Wood's liturgical style is Eucharistically centered, liturgically formal, welcoming and inclusive." He will lead the 8:00 AM service using Rite I and the 10:30 AM service using Rite II to which we are accustomed. He will also continue the 9:15 AM adult Sunday school hour each Sunday.

As Interim Rector, Stuart will work closely with the Wardens, Vestry, staff and other parish leaders toward the major goal of preparing the congregation for the coming of the next Rector.

Hi to all my friends at Christ Church,

I've got quite a history in my 47 years of life! I arrived on June 10, 1968, in Radford, VA, weighing in at 5 lbs., 1 oz. I was named Dorothy Edwards Cronk after my mother and grand-

mother. The name was way too big for me and so everyone started call-

ing me "Dolly" after a dear family friend.

A lot of people were concerned about me but Mom was told over and over that all children develop differently. At 6 months Mom and Dad took me to Richmond to see a wonderful pediatrician who gave me every kind of test you can imagine without any significant results...well, except for incorrect diagnoses. I didn't sleep or eat much for years and still don't if you want to know the truth of it. When Mom tried to teach me things, I kind of ignored her because I really liked it when she held me.

Mom was finally able to get me into a morning program at the local ARC and I really impressed them with what I could do! I still watch everything very closely and know exactly what is going on all around me. I'm pretty quick with my assessments too! Once I was in church with Mom and didn't make a sound, well, until the minister prayed a V E R Y long prayer. He wasn't finished yet and even though I was quiet, still had my head bowed and my hands together, I just could help myself. Out of

not help myself. Out of my mouth came, "yah, de, yah, de, yah, de!" In a quick minute he said "Amen!"

I went to school in Richmond until I was 12 and then to a school outside of Charlottesville on top of a mountain. It's called Faith Mission Home and is run by the Beachy Amish Mennonites and now I have two homes! Aren't I lucky? I really am, you know. I have had two great parents, 2 sisters, Jennifer and Catherine; a brother, Ben and 2 very special nieces, Kylie and Mabel. They all love me and many say that I am the glue that holds our family together. They don't take any vacations without me and make sure I am home for everyone's birthday and all of the special holidays and many other times as well.

I am always willing to help. Sometimes I set the table, wash windows, pick up any trash I have left from my stickers or fold laundry. I'm really neat and tidy and want to do things just right. There are times when I get frustrated, but mostly I'm happy, but I do show a temper every now and then. Oh, I like to talk a lot too. Sometimes this drives Mom nuts! I'm glad Mom believed in me and didn't listen to the doctor who told her I was a vegetable.!

I love coming to Christ Church because I hear about Jesus and God and I get to see a lot of my friends. Everyone has welcomed me so warmly. I really like people a lot and Mom thinks I'm a real blessing because I teach people about what love is all about. You all seem to understand about love because you have accepted me just as I am. Not everyone does that. The key to acceptance is knowing that "special needs" (Mom hates that term) children have the same needs and feelings as everyone else. If you want to know more, just ask Mom. She doesn't mind talking about any aspect of my life. I'll see you soon! Love, Dolly

All the while we are experiencing transition, other committees are actively functioning and planning events and programs to physically, financially and spiritually enhance worship and fellowship at Christ Church.






