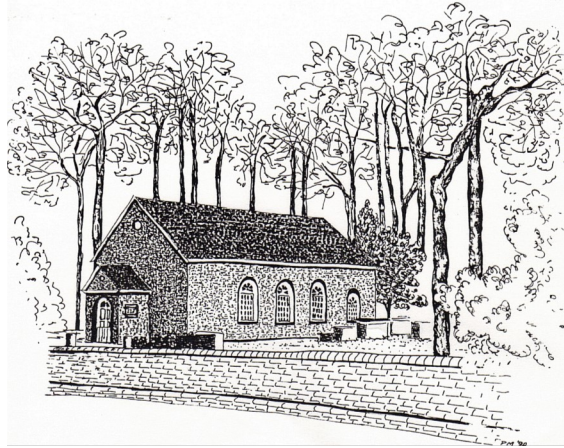

Church Attendance

In recent months, I have heard a rising concern that our Sunday attendance is slipping. I have noticed and commented on it myself. And we are not the only church in our area that is experiencing a decline. Now I realize that we are a very mobile community with couples and individuals having wonderful opportunities to get out and travel quite a bit, visit families, and spend time in Florida and other places during the colder winter months.

So when did this concern about regular church attendance first arise? It was in the latter half of the first century when the Letter to the Hebrews was written.

“Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, **not neglecting to meet together**, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.” (Hebrews 10:23-25 NRSV)

Our times of worship help us to remember who we are and whose we are. It’s a time to praise God for our many blessings, lift up our concerns, be fed with the Word and Eucharist, and to encourage one another. You may not think that you are missed when you are away, but you are. Our worship is diminished by your absence. I know that I really appreciate it when people let me know that they will be away or when they’re sick. We need to look out for one another and be a family of God. In our sometimes hectic lives, we need to be careful that members don’t get lost in the cracks. We also need to be witnesses of Christ and invite those who do not have a faith family to come and join ours.

One of the questions in the Baptismal Covenant that we re-affirm at each baptism and several other occasions throughout the year comes straight out of Acts, “They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.” (Acts 2:42 NRSV) (BCP page 304) We commit to doing this, with God’s help.

Junior Warden Input

Let me start by thanking everyone for their support to Susie and me in prayers, kindness, and love over the past several weeks. It has certainly helped us cope with the issues and provided a positive outcome! This has been a wonderful demonstration that we, of Christ Church Parish, truly are a "family of faith who strive to love God and to love our neighbours as ourselves."

I need to alert all of us that over the past few years, we have seen an increase in usage of Kilowatt-hours for the Parish Hall. This means that there is also a significant increase in our electrical costs for the Parish Hall. Since the most significant electrical loads come from our HVAC units, we have carefully gone over the thermostat settings ensuring that they are correct for this time of year. A very important point is that these settings are most efficient when the doors to each room and the fire doors are closed. Therefore, when rooms are not in use, please keep the doors closed.

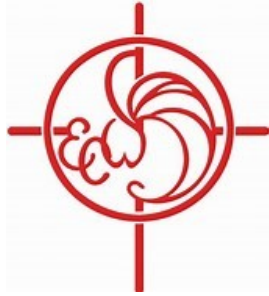


And finally, our Building and Grounds Committee has developed a "Maintenance Plan" for Christ Church Parish that is designed to maintain and improve our facilities over the next 10 years and is broken down in two ways. The first is by area, of which there are three; and the second by the priority of the task, which is done by timing.

The first area is our church itself, both the interior and the exterior. The second area includes the grounds that make up the property of the church. This includes the cemetery, the lawns, the roads and parking lots that we own and maintain. The third area is the Parish Hall, again including both the interior and exterior.

For the priority of the task, we have split that up into three timeframes. The first, or top priority for our plan, includes those tasks/projects that need to be completed this coming year of 2020. Our second priority, though no less important than the first, includes those tasks/projects that we want to complete within five years, or by 2025. And the last priority, but again no less important than the first two, are those tasks/projects that we want to complete within the next six to ten years, or by 2030. In our September Newsletter, there is a brief explanation of how we arrived at those priorities which ultimately will result in our facilities being attractive and welcoming to our current members, our guests, and to our future members.

The total estimated cost for the capital projects/tasks listed on the Plan total over \$500,000 over the ten years. Most of that money is not going to come from our annual budget because that much money is not there. But instead, it needs to come from more creative ways such as grants, special donations, or possibly reserves or some other source. The current draft of the Plan is posted on our Vestry Bulletin Board. Please know that this document will always be subject to change and adjustments, based on changing circumstances and your suggestions. The important thing is that we use a viable "Plan" as we determine what to accomplish each year.
