#### **Message From Our Rector**



As I sit down to write this, I am aware that the Fall season begins tomorrow. Leaves have already begun to change color and fall to the ground. The mornings are a bit cooler and it won't be too much longer before I find myself driving to church on Sunday mornings in the dark. I usually get here between 6:00 and 6:30 a.m. So, whether we like it or not, the world around us is constantly changing and our lives are also changing. Many of you received an email that was sent out on

September 20<sup>th</sup>, but for those of you who didn't receive that email it was announcing that I will be retiring at the end of June next year. The Vestry has already met with a representative from the Diocese on September 19<sup>th</sup> to begin the transition process. This means that there is time to do it prayerfully and not rushed.

Why do I want to retire next year? Well, besides the fact that I will be 65 in January and have been in full time ordained ministry for almost 36 years, I believe that you all are doing such wonderful things right now and that the search for a new priest can only lead you to new and exciting learnings and growth. The Vestry and the various church ministries are accomplishing so much. You should all feel great about how well stewardship, outreach, your on-line Sunday services, fellowship, worship, and the ongoing maintenance and preservation of this historic place of worship is going, because it's going in a positive direction.

The next nine months are important for all of us. It requires serious prayer and planning. This is not a time to slow down. No, the opposite is true. Our stewardship campaign for 2024 is so very important right now. As we continue to fund our regular ministries next year, we will also have some added expenses in the budget related to the transition and search for your next priest.

I then hope to fill another important ministry that is so needed in this area of the Diocese and that is in the role of a supply priest where I can experience other congregations on Sunday mornings. But this will also allow me more time to spend with family, work on my house, and to hopefully travel.

May our loving and gracious God continue to bless us and guide us through these uncharted waters of life.

Then choosing hymn setting for each Sunday - those are organ arrangements of the hymns that add variety to the verses. I download electronic files of the music to my IPad Pro into a special music program called For Score.

Lots of time is spent communicating. Sending info to Father Stuart for the bulletin and to the Tech Team for the video service. Going online and reporting the music played each Sunday to the licensing website. Preparing weekly emails to the choir with info on all the upcoming music. Attending Worship and planning meetings.

Next comes practicing and more practicing. Sunday morning finds me in the choir room at 9:00 ready to rehearse. Then that walk across the parking lot to the sanctuary and it is go time - my favorite hour of the week. Because to me it is more than just a job: I love what I do. Thank you for letting me do that here.
