

Intentional Stewardship

On the last Sunday of September, we will observe Stewardship Sunday. It will be our opportunity to come together and turn in our pledge cards for the 2020-year budget. But wait a minute. Stewardship isn't just about pledge cards. Stewardship is a fact of life that covers far more than simply our wallets. When we stop and realize that everything we have comes from God – our time on earth, the talents we have, and whatever we have materially – we begin to understand that stewardship is a fact of life. It is something that everyone does whether they are religious or not. From a secular point of view, we might simply call it by another term, “budgeting”.



We need to ask ourselves, “Am I being a good steward of all that God has given me?” Well, if you find that you are over-committed and there isn't enough time in the day, then you may not be a good steward of your time. If you have overspent on your credit cards and are having to pay interest each month, then you may not be a good steward of your finances. The reality is, we are exercising stewardship each time we make a decision about what we will do or not do. As Christians, we are called to bring a level of intentionality to our stewardship, determining how we will spend the wealth of time, talent, and treasure with which we have been entrusted. The same is true for the Church itself. Our finance committee and Vestry work hard to make the best use of the resources that have been entrusted to them for the work of the church and your feedback will help them do a better job. Our committees also work hard at utilizing the talents of individuals that have been offered for the work of this community. As we work together, we need to support one another in prayer, asking that God's will be done and not simply our own. We need to remember that intentional stewardship is a life of consciousness about whose we are, the circumstances of our lives, and the opportunities that we have been given – individually and collectively as a community of faith.



Featuring Some our Churches Beautiful Service Silver



Silver Chalice

This is a chalice with a baluster stem on a circular base with a rolled rim at the lip of the cup. It is engraved "A gift from Hon. Ralph Wormley in 1713 to Christ Church, Middlesex. Remodeled in 1855" It measures 8 1/4" high by 4 1/2" in diameter. It weighs 375 1/2 grams.



Silver Flagon

This is a contemporary sterling silver footed flagon with a hinged cover surmounted by a cross and a handle with "c" scrolls at the top and the bottom. The monogram "HIS" is engraved on the side. The inscription on the inside of the foot rim reads "Presented to Christ Church, Middlesex County, Virginia in Memory of John Bristow Clerk, by his descendants of the Ninth Generation, Gordon Wooley". The flagon measures 12 1/2" in height, including the cross and the base is 4" in diameter and weighs 809 grams. The Flagon is marked sterling and the maker's mark is MR in a circle over a vase is unidentified.



Silver Goblet

This beautiful octagonal footed silver goblet is a newer addition to the Christ Church Parish alter Guild's collection of silver. It was given in loving memory of Bill Perkins by his wife, Liz. Liz has been a long time member of the Alter Guild.
