

Finally, I need to thank the Tech Team as these folks provide the technology that enables shut-ins and folks far away to see our worship services and to listen to God's word every Sunday.



# **FELLOWSHIP COMMITTEE**

The final days of Father Stuart's job as Rector at Christ Parish are drawing near. In fact, the actual date for his last morning service is Sunday, June 30<sup>th</sup>. On Saturday, June 29<sup>th</sup>, we will figuratively raise the roof from 4 PM to 7 PM and prepare a Gala to recognize Father Stuart's 8 years of service and friendship to CCP and parishioners and to extend a toast of good cheer for a happy retirement.

The party will begin with Father Stuart leading us to the edge of Route 33 in front of our church for the dedication of our new Virginia State Historical Highway Marker commemorating the church's history since 1666. The new marker will be emblematic of a new era new beginning with a new priest. Ms. Jennifer Loux from Virginia's Historical Highway Marker Program will join us for the dedication and dinner festivities to follow.
