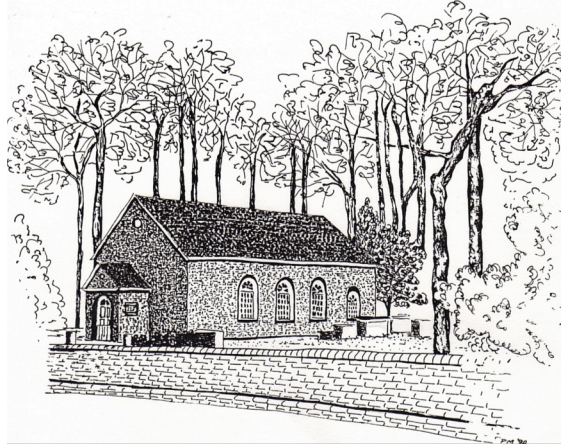

With all the emphasis of Christmas placed before Christmas day, many have no desire to carry on the celebration through the actual twelve days of Christmas. It's counter-cultural to carry on the celebration until the Feast of Epiphany. Romans 12:2 reminds us "that we should not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." Continuing our celebration of Christmas throughout the season is our opportunity to bear witness to the fact that there is more to this season than parties, gifts, eating, and Santa Claus as many people have made it, but it is, in fact, the celebration of the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ the Lord.

So when people ask why my decorations are still up? The answer is "I put them up in preparation of celebrating our Savior's birth and that celebration lasts until the 5th of January – Twelfth Night. So until January 5th, you will still hear me saying to people, "Merry Christmas" and when they say, "but Christmas is over" I will remind them that the 12 days of Christmas began Christmas Day and didn't end that day. Besides, we should be carrying the joy of Christmas in our hearts every day of the year.

The Rector's Discretionary Fund

What is it, where does it come from and how is it used?

You may not know that the Rector of Christ Church Parish (Episcopal) has a Discretionary fund. There are a number of funding sources but one of the major sources comes on the First Sunday of every month and that is the cash from the Offering Plates. Other sources come from the ECW & the Brotherhood. From time to time the Rector will receive a cash contribution from an event that he officiates and that goes to that Fund. You can also write a check for the Fund and give it to the Rector or Parish Administrator. Now, the question you might have is, how does Father Stuart distribute these funds? It is important to know that these funds are used to help members of Christ Church Parish who might be in need. Father Stuart's relationship with each of us is similar to the Doctor/patient relationship. This is important, because many folks may be too proud to publicly ask for help when it is needed for themselves, their children or their family. This way, they can go to Father Stuart, get some help when it is needed and they will know it won't become public knowledge. Obviously, he doesn't have unlimited funding but will always try to help in some way or another. So, remember the cash in the plate on the first Sunday goes to directly help a parishioner in need!

OUTREACH COMMITTEE—Jean Holt, Chair



Close to \$400 was given at our **Community Thanksgiving service** to be shared with St. Paul Baptist Church up in the Church View area who experienced a devastating fire just prior to this service.

Middlesex teachers: Prayers for our County teachers continue each Wednesday during the Eucharist service. In the new year, we will send some items such as coffee and small surprises to the teacher lounges to let them

know that we support their great work with our county students.

Thanks to **Bev Hart**, who is retiring from this committee. Many projects were served well by Bev over the last year, such as our leader for the Unity World Festival and One Community under God events; and designing and promoting the sale of CCP T-shirts. Clayton Neal and Jack Fackler have graciously volunteered to be the point persons for these community events. Also, Jack keeps us up to date on the needs of Hands Across Middlesex and Clayton remains the contact for our participation with Habitat For Humanity.

Social Services – because of our generous donations last year, we were able to fill 9 bags for the Social Services to give to children who may be entering Foster care. Social services will inform us when more children's bags are needed. This year, **our focus** will be to supply bags filled with **needs for seniors** who may have just returned home from the hospital, or moved to a nursing facility and are unable to gather supplies needed during the gap from coming home until their social service programs resume. Social Services had a recent donation of hygiene products, so we will concentrate on **items** such as:

- * Non-perishables such as apple sauce, fruit cups, and bottled water.
- * Puzzle books (word search, crossword, etc.)
- * Puzzles
- * Books (large print)
- * Paper Towels/toilet paper –(these items are not covered by SNAP benefits and are hard for older adults to obtain if they have no transportation or are not up to driving). (Continued on page 6)

The final tally for the Oyster Festival resulted in net proceeds of \$19,914.01, which was another tremendous year. The Brotherhood voted to take advantage of this strong year to increase our seed money from \$10,700 to \$13,500 as our past costs indicate that the increase is needed.
