Father Stuart's Message for November 2017 NOW THANK WE ALL OUR GOD

Fall is here and the days are growing shorter and the nights cooler. Where has the year gone? Before we know it, it will be Thanksgiving Day, followed by Advent, then Christmas, and finally New Years. But before I get too far ahead of myself, let's just focus on Thanksgiving.

Thanksgiving Day means many different things to people. It may be turkey and a dining room table laden with more food than we can possibly eat. It may be the parades and the football games. For some, it is a morning of hunting and for others, it is sifting through the mountain of newspaper ads scoping out the Black Friday deals.

I often find myself thinking musically with such hymns as "We gather together to ask the Lord's blessing", "Come ye thankful people come", "We plow the fields, and scatter the good seed on the land", "Songs of thankfulness and praise, Jesus, Lord, to Thee we raise" and then there's my favorite:

'Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices, Who wondrous things has done, in Whom this world rejoices; Who from our mothers' arms has blessed us on our way With countless gifts of love, and still is ours today.' But in reality, thanksgiving isn't something we celebrate only once a year. We are in fact celebrating thanksgiving every time we gather to share Holy Communion. What do we call Communion? We call it the Holy Eucharist and this word "eucharist" is full of meaning. This curious word has its origin in Latin *eucharistia*, and Greek *eukharistia* which means "thanksgiving, or gratitude" and from *eukharistos* meaning "grateful". *Eukharisteo* is the usual verb for "to thank, to be thankful".

So each time we gather around the Lord's table, it's good to remember that this is also a Thanksgiving Feast full of God's love, grace, and generosity; thus we call the Eucharistic Prayer, "The Great Thanksgiving" for we remember with gratitude the gift of Christ given freely to each and every one of us.

We will be having a Thanksgiving Day service in the church at 10 a.m.

May you each have a Happy Thanksgiving whether it be Thursday, November 23rd, at any Holy Eucharist during the year, or whenever you are gathered together with family and friends and give thanks.




