Funding Your 2024 Pledge Contributions

Our 2024 Annual Giving Campaign is fast approaching, and the Finance Committee is busy identifying next year's financial needs. It is much easier preparing the budget knowing the funds available. As you prepare your pledge card and consider how your generosity will be funded, we hope those eligible will consider utilizing this year's required minimum distribution (RMD).

Required Minimum Distribution

A required minimum distribution (RMD) is the amount of money that must be withdrawn from an employer-sponsored retirement plan, traditional IRA, SEP, or SIMPLE individual retirement account (IRA) by owners and qualified retirement plan participants of retirement age. The required minimum distribution is the amount you must take out of your account to avoid tax consequences.

In 2023, the age at which you must begin taking RMDs changed to 73 years. Another significant change from Secure 2.0: Starting in 2024, holders of designated Roth 401(k) accounts will no longer be required to take RMDs from them (during their lifetime). This rule is already true for Roth IRAs.

Reminder - Qualified charitable distributions may reduce your taxable income

What many retirees don't know is they can donate all, or a portion of, their RMD directly to charity. It's called a qualified charitable distribution, or QCD.

A QCD can be a very tax-effective way to support a charity, such as Christ Church Parish. However, it's important to first understand the details and limitations. Qualified charitable distributions do *not* provide a charitable deduction for taxpayers. Instead, with a qualified charitable distribution, a check is sent directly from an IRA to charity. This allows the donor to exclude the amount from taxable income. Should you have questions, contact your IRA administrator to facilitate this pledge/gift. Christ Church does not offer tax advice.

Catechism Corner

Last month we examined the specialized word incarnate; here are three other words from the Bible that some laypeople might need help understanding:

Sanctification: refers to the process of becoming holy or set apart for God. It is often used in the Bible to describe the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of believers.

Justification: This word refers to the act of being declared righteous by God. It is based on the work of Jesus Christ on the cross, who took the punishment for our sins so that we could be forgiven and made right with God.

Regeneration: This refers to the new birth, or the spiritual transformation that takes place when a person comes to faith in Jesus Christ. It is a work of the Holy Spirit that transforms a person's heart and nature.

As Verger, I've been witness to the uncertainty and agony of delayed decision-making. If you love your family, don't put them through this. Be the grown-up in the room and put together your will, funeral planning, and directives, and talk to your family and your rector. You do not know when that day or that hour will come. Don't let it come and find you unprepared. Please.

Funding Christ Church's Future By Contributing to The Endowment

Millions of Americans make donations of cash and property to the charities of their choice each year. September 27 - Tishrei 1

Feast of Trumpets the first of the three fall feasts is a day of rest and a holy convocation.

Ezra and the Feast: Ezra and the people returned to Jerusalem from Babylon.

Binding of Isaac: This is the day that Abraham bound Isaac to the altar. The Lord tested Abraham's faith and then provided a sacrifice for him to offer.

September 28 – Tishrei 2

On the seventh and final day of the Creation week, God ceased His work and rested.

Days of Awe: The ten days between the Feast of Trumpets and the Day of Atonement are a time for introspection, repentance, and restoring broken relationships with one another in preparation for the Day of Atonement.

September 29 – Tishrei 3

Fast of the Seventh Month traditionally is held on the third day of this month.
